





#### **GULLS BECAUSE:**

- Large numbers of gulls can affect bathing under quality as their droppings contain high levels bacteria.
- Feeding gulls encourages them to dive and snatch food which can cause injuries.
- the need to encourage gulls to hunt for their food their natural habitat and not off your plate!

#### **HINTS & TIPS TO** AVOID A GULL ATTACK:

- · Eat with your back against a wall to avoid them sneaking up behind you.
- · Bin any unwanted food in bins provided.
- · Throwing the gulls food is classed as littering -Please don't encourage them.
- · Keep food close to you and stay alert!

As a group we schedule periods when we all put out the same message so it has a bigger impact across all of our networks!




