

Welsh National Marine Plan (WNMP)

Cynllun Morol Cenedlaethol Cymru



- Marine and Coastal Access Act (2009)
 Provides legislative basis for a marine planning system
- Marine Policy Statement (2011) is the framework for marine plans and taking decisions
- The Welsh National Marine Plan will translate the MPS into detailed policy and spatial guidance for the Welsh Marine Plan area to guide and direct decision-making
- Public authorities must take account of the plans (in various ways, with exceptions) when making decisions (MaCAA s58)



Wales: Policy Context

For Wales this is set within the context of our wider reform policies and the development of an integrated approach to governance includes:

- Taking Wales Forwards 2016-2021
- Well-being of Future Generations Act (2015)
- Green and Blue Growth Agenda
- The Environment (Wales) Act (2016)
- The Planning (Wales) Act (2015)
- Historic Environment (Wales) Act (2016)
- Wales Act (2017)

WNMP General Policies (Draft)

- **General policies** cover topics including nature conservation, water quality, sustainable use, seascapes, coastal communities and economic growth, cumulative growth, heritage etc.
- **General policies** are organised under the themes of the shared UK High Level Marine Objectives (MPS):
 - Achieving a sustainable marine economy
 - Ensuring a strong and just society
 - Living within environmental limits

WNMP Sector Policies (Draft)

Sector Policies are set out for the diverse types of activity that occur in our seas, including:




- Sector policies may include 'supporting' and/or 'safeguarding' policies to help ensure each sector can develop in a sustainable way
- Supporting policy can encourage sustainable growth via general support, or within areas with good potential for future activities
- These areas are identified on maps as Strategic Resource Areas (SRAs)

WNMP - Where are we now?

- Draft WNMP has been developed in accordance with requirements set out in MCAA Schedule 6
- Takes account of best possible evidence Strategic Scoping Exercise and Wales Marine Evidence Report
- Inputs from wide range of stakeholders across UK and sign off from policy leads
- Sustainability Appraisal & Habitats Regulations Assessment
- Next steps will be sign off from Cabinet Secretary for Environment and Rural Affairs and Secretary of State for Defra
- Consultation for a period of 12 weeks planned for autumn
- Stakeholder engagement during consultation with 5 public events around the Welsh coast plus national stakeholder seminar/workshop

WNMP Implementation

- Responses to the public consultation
- Final sign off of the WNMP
- Developing training and implementation guidance
- Planning pilot projects to 'test drive' policies
- Public authorities group
- Monitoring & reporting

- WNMP is an integrated planning <u>and policy delivery mechanism</u>.
- Polices are to be interpreted in a broad based, precautionary manner (SD, WfG, SMNR etc)
- Full stakeholder involvement in the process (See SPP Statement of Public Participation)
- Start of 12 week consultation on the WNMP planned for this autumn
