


Background Information:



- Discovered in Newport, Wales in 2002
- Built after AD 1449 (likely in the Basque country of Northern Spain), with additional British-grown timber fitted to the vessel after AD 1465
- A late medieval example of a large clinker-built merchant vessel (with 1000+ artefacts)
- Well-preserved by anoxic river sediments
- Capable of direct/long-duration voyages
- Substantial evidence of trade with the Iberian Peninsula, especially Portugal.
- Ended its working life in Newport after the spring of AD 1468
- Partially salvaged in antiquity











