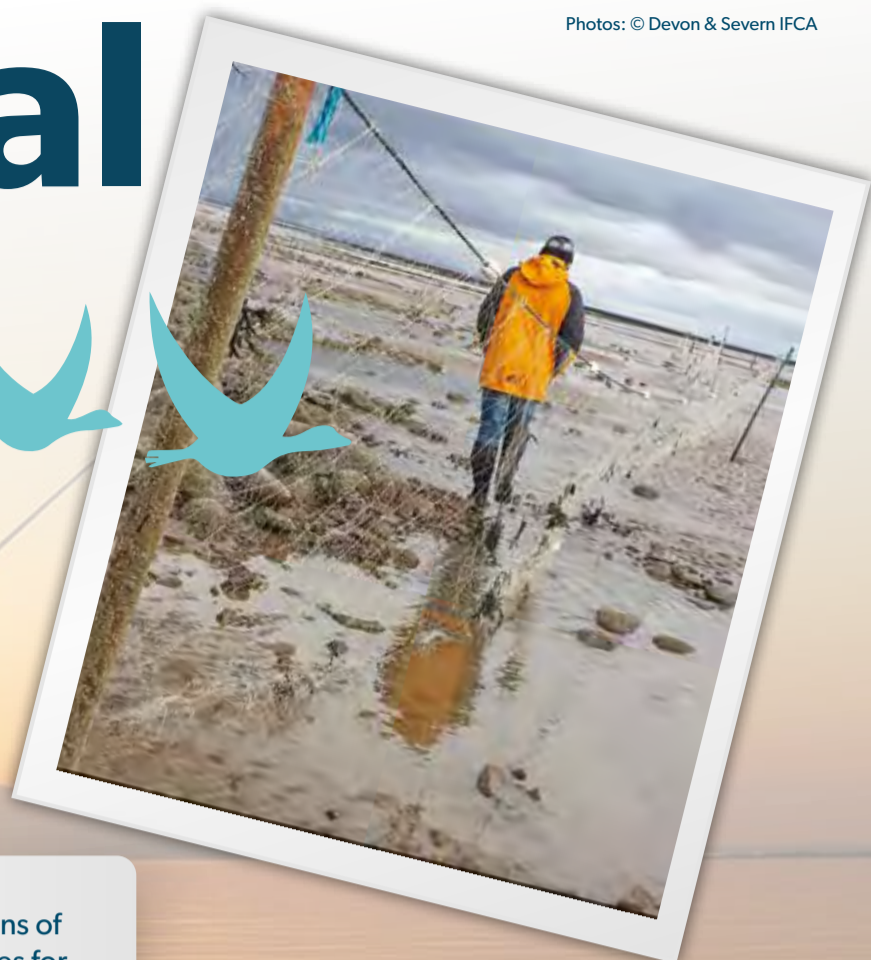

Calling all Recreational Fishers in the Severn Estuary

What is Marine Planning?

Marine planning is a new approach to the management of our seas. It aims to ensure a sustainable future for coastal and offshore waters through managing and balancing the many activities, resources and natural features of our marine environment.

Marine planning follows a similar approach to terrestrial planning – setting the direction for policies at a local level. These plans are used by public authorities as part of the decision making process for all new activities and developments affecting the marine area.

The MMO values the expert opinions of fishers in helping to develop policies for the new South West Marine Plan; the Plan that will shape the ways our seas are used for years to come. All operators, regulators and (all types of) fishers will be expected to work to the same Plan to make decision-making as fair and as transparent as possible. This includes those who use fish traps, netters and anglers.

It is therefore essential that recreational fishers are aware of, and understand, the implications of the new South West Marine Plan as it is developed.

Marine Planning in the Severn

The Severn Estuary is a single waterbody covered by two marine planning systems. The South West Marine Plan is being developed by the Marine Management Organisation (MMO) and the Welsh National Marine Plan is being developed by Welsh Government (WG).
